NEEDLES SNOW CAMP 17-18 JAN

THE OFTEN MOVED LOCATION FOR THIS TRIP ENDED UP AT THE NEEDLES AS BOTH SNOW CONDITIONS AND PARTICIPANTS SEEMED TO FAVOR THIS LOCATION. THE INCLUSION OF THIS AREA IN THE CALIF SNOW PARK SYSTEM HAS RESULTED IN INCREASED VISITOR TRAFFIC OVER WHAT WE HAD EXPERIENCED IN PREVIOUS YEARS. SNOWMOBILES USE BOTH THE AREAS SET ASIDE FOR THEM, AND AREAS SET ASIDE FOR CROSS COUNTRY SKIERS. IN PAST YEARS WE CAMPED IN THE WOODS NEAR THE PONDEROSA LODGE AND MADE DAY TOURS TO DOME ROCK AREA ON ONE DAY, AND TOURED OUT TO THE NEEDLES ON THE OTHER. DOME ROCK IS NOW IN AN AREA DESIGNATED FOR SNOWMOBILE USE. THE NEEDLES LOCKOUT TRAIL IS OPEN TO BOTH SKIERS AND SNOWMOBILES. TENT CAMPING NEAR THE PONDEROSA IS NO LONGER ADVISABLE DUE TO THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE IN THE AREA. CAUTION IS ADVISED WHEN DRIVING IN THE AREA AS BEER BOTTLES ARE SOMETIMES LEFT ON THE ROAD HIDDEN BY SNOW.

AS A RESULT OF THESE CHANGES WE DECIDED TO SKI OUT TO THE END OF THE NEEDLES ROAD AND ESTABLISH A CAMP IN THE WOODS OUT OF SIGHT OF THE ROAD. AS THE DISTANCE TO THE CAMP WAS ONLY THREE MILES FROM THE PARKING AREA SOME OF THE PARTICIPANTS DECIDED TO SKI BACK TO THE CARS AND DRIVE TO THE PONDEROSA LODGE FOR DINNER, RETURNING TO THE CAMP BEFORE MIDNIGHT. OTHERS DAY TOURED NEAR CAMP AND WENT TO BED EARLY. ON SUNDAY ALL PARTICIPANTS TOURED OUT TO THE NEEDLES. AFTER THE TOUR, CAMP WAS STRUCK AND EVERYBODY SKIED DOWN THE ICY ROAD TO THE CARS. A.F.
