Nine spirited, smiling skiers showed up for the Annual SMS New Year's Ostrander Trip—six bound for the warm, cozy hut (Eddie Nunez, Marcia Male, Diann Fried, Tom Marsh, Pete Matulavich, and Nancy Gordon) and three bound and determined snow campers (Joe McGuire and newlyweds Elena and Cory Hinds). It's always a small miracle that we all show up at 0800 at the Badger Pass where greetings, eating breakfast, and trip logistics are delightfully intermixed.

We had excellent snow coverage on Glacier Point Road and only a few places on Horizon Ridge had thin snow coverage on our 9-10 mile approach to the hut. It was certainly more than we anticipated. At the Horizon Ridge turn off on glacier Point Road, we regrouped, stopping for a bite to eat, putting on climbing skins, and offering moral support for those straining under the weight of gargantuan packs. They had hauled in a 15-pound turkey, enough spirits to warm the cockles of W. C. Field's heart, and an abundance of a very identifiable, aromatic herb. Several of us delighted in ice skating by starlight, and some partied to their heart's content New Year's Eve, seriously red-lining the fun-meter. The hut was suspiciously quiet until the sun was high above the horizon on January 1st. Happy New Year!

After a scenic tour to the top of Horse Ridge for magnificent vistas, we gravitated to huge powder pockets above Hart Lake and at the Overlook just west of the hut. Talk about unexpected delight! We celebrated this marvelous ski day as we dined feasting on Polish cucumber-tomato-dill salad, seafood linguini (salmon and crab with all sorts of veggies), garlic bread, and carrot cake. It was delicious! Thanks to Marcia for planning and executing this feast. But we all miss Rose terribly.

This was Marcia's 9th, Eddie's 8th, and my 5th or 6th Ostrander New Year's. After this trip, I'm in better shape, I've cranked a few backcountry teles, and I've shared a wonderful experience with people I enjoy. What a splendid way to start a new year!



Telemark skiing was reborn in the early 1970's around Crested Butte, CO by skiers who wanted a technique that brought downhill stability to their free-beeled gear. These skiers played with and refined the Telemark turn into what we now know as the American Telemark Technique. Skiing aboad, U.S. telemark skiers and Instructors have exported this style of skiing around the world, including Norway, which makes its rebirth complete.
